Loken has been designing and building homes for more than twenty-five years, with an emphasis on resource conservation in design, material selection and construction in historic preservation and remodeling projects, as well as new construction in both residential and commercial buildings. He currently owns and operates Loken Builders in Missoula, Montana.

Since 1983 Loken has spoken and taught at industry and government sponsored conferences, seminars, and workshops across the country, and served as the keynote speaker for the first National Green Building Conference, sponsored by NAHB. He has been a key researcher, tester and auditor for conservation programs for clients as diverse as the National Building Museum in Washington DC, KST Construction Company of Japan, Amoco Chemical Company, Danish Housing and Systems Technology, and the University of Helsinki in Finland.

As a Building Technology Specialist for the National Center for Appropriate Technology, US. Department of Energy, in Butte, Montana, Loken has researched and tested alternative indoor ventilation strategies in low-infiltration housing, and developed training seminars for super-insulated energy-efficient construction. He also worked as a Residential Construction Specialist/Contractor and Researcher for the Montana Department of Natural Resources and Conservation where he organized and conducted training sessions on energy-efficient housing design and construction; and researched passive solar and energy-efficient houses throughout Montana.
