MONTH'S SUPPLY OF HOUSING INVENTORY AS OF APRIL 2025



King County had **2.2 months' supply** of inventory (up from 1.3 in April 2024)



Snohomish County had **1.6 months' supply** of inventory (up from .8 in April 2024)

Many industry analysts consider a four- to six-month level an indicator of a healthy market.

MEDIAN HOME PRICE

APRIL 2025



The median price of single-family homes and condos was **\$907,000** in King County and **\$755,550** in Snohomish County.



For single-family homes only, the median price in King County increased 5%, from \$980,000 a year ago to **\$1,030,000.** The median price in Snohomish County remained unchanged at **\$799,950**.

BUILDER CONFIDENCE

National and Regional HMI Change

The Housing Market Index (HMI) was **34** nationally, down 24% year over year.

In the West, the HMI was 28.

The HMI is based on a monthly survey of NAHB members designed to take the pulse of the single-family housing market.



BUILDING PERMITS

The following building permit data is for the Seattle Metro Area (including King, Snohomish, and Pierce counties).

1,561 Single-Family Permits (YTD as of March 31, 2025) YTD % Change Compared to 2024: -**11.8%**

1,637 Multifamily Permits (YTD as of March 31, 2025) YTD % Change Compared to 2024: -**45.8%**

JOBS



The Washington unemployment rate for April 2025 is **4.4%**; for Seattle/Bellevue/ Everett it is **4.3%**.

Construction employment in Washington **decreased by 6,000** between April 2024 and April 2025. Total employment in construction is **210,800 statewide**.
